
District 126 iPad Cheat Sheet

- Once you get the iPad, you'll need to connect it to your home Wi-Fi. <u>Instructions</u> on how to do that from Apple are below:

After you join a network, you'll see $\sqrt{\ }$ next to the network and $\widehat{\ }$ in the upper-left corner of your display or the upper-right corner on an iPhone X and later.
